Co-op Producer of the Month: Murphy Family Farm

The Marsh River Co-op is proud to spotlight local Murphy Family Farm of Freedom in our new monthly feature, where we will present short bios of Co-op producer members. Co-owner/operators of Murphy Family Farm, Sean Murphy and Anna Mueller (right), provide fresh produce to the Co-op.

Here's what they have to say:



"This will be our second season growing on our new family farm in Freedom. We will be growing on approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ acres. The farm currently produces veggies for sale through direct to consumer outlets, a collaborative home delivery CSA in greater Bangor, and co-ops and other wholesale accounts throughout mid-Maine.

Sustainability is at the core of our farm and every decision that we make. We are always working to improve our soils and the biodiversity of our small slice of Maine. During our first season we accumulated over 25 tons of organic matter to add to our soils, over 96% of which was sourced from Maine fields, forests, and seas.

We have planted and tended to hundreds of trees on a landscape that had been used by a commercial dairy for green-chop hay and genetically modified corn production. The transformation is alive and well, and just getting started. We sprayed absolutely nothing on the farm last year, except for water, and we intend to keep it that way.

We are proud to be a part of the burgeoning local economy here in Waldo county. Our property straddles the 10-mile mark as dictated in the Marsh River Co-Op bylaws, and we can actually point to the spot where the co-op sits from our hilltop property. The co-op is our new grocery store, where we go each week to resupply our freezer, fridge and cupboards. We couldn't be happier to be a part of this community."

You Can Get Involved!

Volunteers make the Co-op run, and keep our prices reasonable. We can always use more volunteers to lighten the load on the dedicated individuals who continue to put in a lot of time to keep the doors open. Volunteer shifts are 2 hours long; a 12-hour per month commitment earns you an extra 10% above the regular 5% member discount! But, we'll be happy to have you volunteer any amount of time that you are able. You can sign up for a regular weekly shift, or sign up on a shift-by-shift basis, by visiting the store. We can use help with numerous tasks, including pricing and stocking items, straightening the store, and running the cash register for the retail oriented, and re-stocking grain and farm supply items for the heavy lifters. We'll train you to a task you're comfortable with when you come in. You need not be a member to volunteer.
